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**VALLEY HEALTH EXPANDS SERVICE AREA TO INCLUDE MASON COUNTY**  
***Valley Health now operating three health centers in Gallipolis Ferry and Point Pleasant***

**Huntington, W.Va.** – Valley Health, a regional leader in primary care, is pleased to announce expansion of its service area to now include three community health center locations in Mason County.

Valley Health's expansion to Mason County has included a partnership with three existing Mason County medical practices and was executed in collaboration with Pleasant Valley Hospital as a means of establishing Mason County's first network of federally-qualified health centers (FQHCs). FQHCs are community-based organizations that provide comprehensive primary medical and preventive care, including health, dental and mental health services to people of all ages, regardless of ability to pay.

The three Mason County health centers now under Valley Health's management include the Gallipolis Ferry-based family medicine practice of Damia Hayman, CFNP, the Point Pleasant-based OB/GYN practice of Mark Nolan, MD, and the pediatrics practice of John Wiltz, MD, also in Point Pleasant.

"While our name may be new to those in Mason County, patients currently affiliated with the practices now under our management will continue to have their healthcare needs taken care of at the same location and by the same providers they have grown to know and trust," stated Valley Health CEO and Executive Director, Steve Shattls. "In fact, those patients can anticipate an even broader level of medical services through Valley Health's extensive network."

The expanded service opportunities Valley Health affords the Mason County community include the ability to serve the uninsured through a sliding fee scale program, access to family planning, access to the Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program and access to the Vaccines for Children Program. Additionally, Valley Health offers a broad array of primary care services that patients can access through a number of different locations.

"Valley Health is in the business of quality healthcare," Shattls said. "Furthermore, we're in the business of ensuring that quality, affordable healthcare is accessible to everyone. We take
